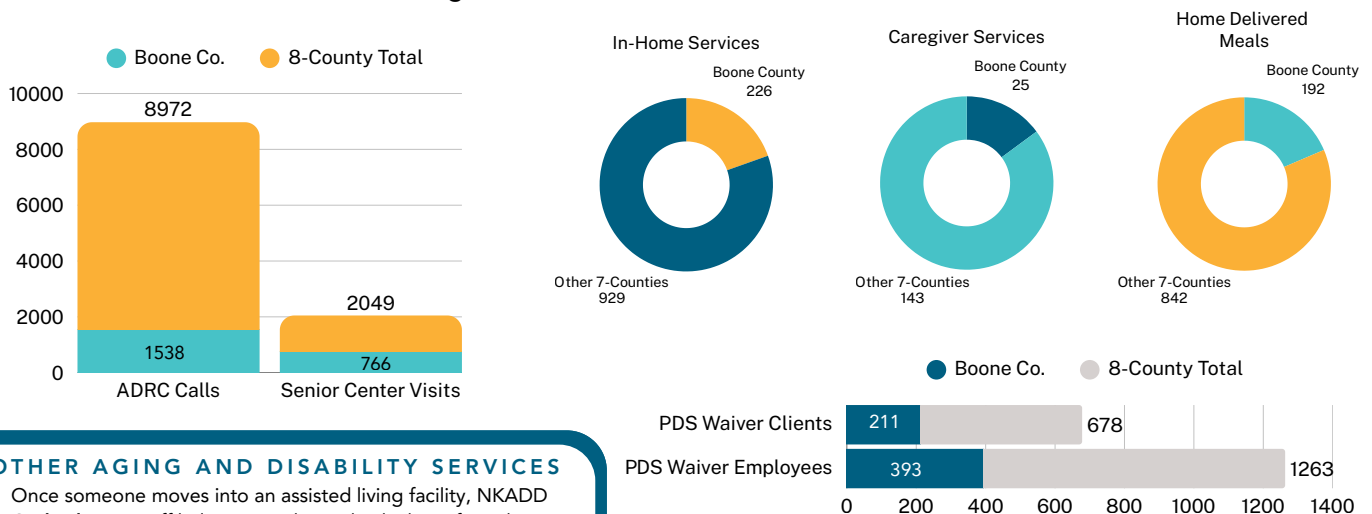


# NKADD

### AGING AND DISABILITY SERVICES

NKADD empowers older adults and individuals with disabilities to live independently in their homes by providing services and access to programs such as the Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC), Home Delivered Meals, In-Home and Caregiver Services, and Medicaid Waiver Assistance.



#### OTHER AGING AND DISABILITY SERVICES

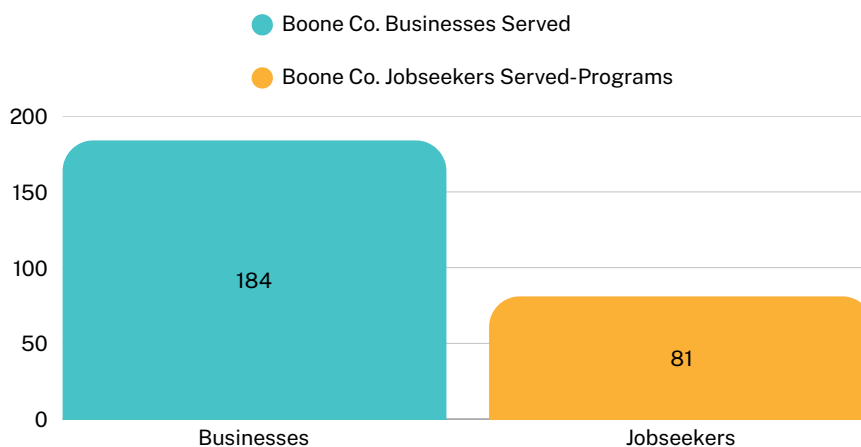
- Once someone moves into an assisted living facility, NKADD **Ombudsman** staff help ensure that individual is safe and their rights are upheld.
- The **Mobility** team coordinates with clients, communities, and providers to help individuals receive non-emergency medical transportation and other rides.

NKADD's Workforce team provides strategic direction and supportive services to build and maintain a thriving economy. NKADD workforce programs include Youth First, Employee Connections, and Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) programs and initiatives.

#### ADDITIONAL WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES:

**NKY Works** is a collective impact workforce initiative dedicated to cultivating a workforce that is enthusiastic, prepared, and capable of filling and retaining quality jobs across all sectors of Northern Kentucky's economy. NKY Works is housed at NKADD and supported through a partnership with the Fiscal Courts of Boone, Campbell and Kenton Counties and BE NKY Growth Partnership.

**Kentucky Career Centers** Northern Kentucky works with regional partners to provide on-site resources for jobseekers to prepare, train, and find a career. There is one location in Boone County: the CVG Career Center.

## PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION SERVICES

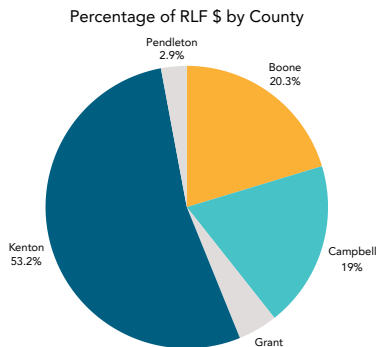
The NKADD staffs several professional organizations, including the NKY City/County Managers Association (NKCCMA), the Municipal Government League of Northern Kentucky (MGLNK), the NKY Public Entity Joint Health Insurance Board (NKPEJHIB), the NKY branch of the American Public Works Association (NKY APWA), the KYTC Regional Transportation Committee (RTC), the NKY Regional Ethics Authority (NKREA), the Water Management Council (WMC), and the Covington Motor Vehicle Parking Authority (CMVPA).

## REVOLVING LOAN FUND

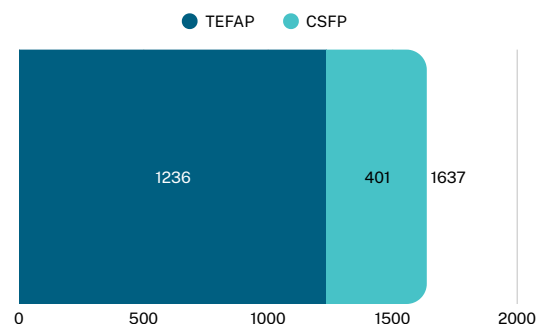
Established through a grant from the US Economic Development Administration, the Revolving Loan Fund program administered by NKADD provides a flexible and sustainable source of public funding for small business owners who cannot otherwise obtain adequate financing through private sources. Loans made through the RLF provide a necessary source of capital for small business owners that helps stimulate the local economy, create and retain jobs, and encourage private investment in the region. NKADD has made 40 loans totaling approximately \$2.2 million and creating 207 jobs since the original grant was received in 1998.



## COMMODITIES

NKADD serves as the USDA Food Bank for the region's food pantries. Commodities from The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) and the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) are distributed to individuals through partnerships with 42 food pantries, mobile pantries, and soup kitchens across the eight-county region plus one location each in Bracken and Mason Counties. CSFP is eligible to adults over age 60. Warehouse staff processed 62,103 cases of food in FY25, a value of \$2,224,090.80.

## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING

### WATER AND WASTEWATER

- NKADD is contracted by the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) to serve as liaison and technical support for our jurisdictions.
- There are 21 proposed KIA water projects and six proposed KIA sewer projects for Boone County currently active in the Water Resource Information System Portal.
- There are four KIA projects for Boone County with committed funds:
  - Central Boone County Master Sewer Plan-Phase II-\$14,457,809 committed.
  - Northern Boone County Gravity-Phase IAI-\$3,903,809 in Cleaner Water Funds.
  - Boone County Rural Waterline Extensions-\$1,226,476 in Cleaner Water Funds.
  - Boone County Rural Water Project-Phase II-\$1,000,000 in HB 267 Tobacco Grant
- Boone County is serviced in part by Boone County Water District and Bullock Pen Water District with 491.93 miles of waterline and by Sanitation District No. 1 with 460.65 miles of sewerline.

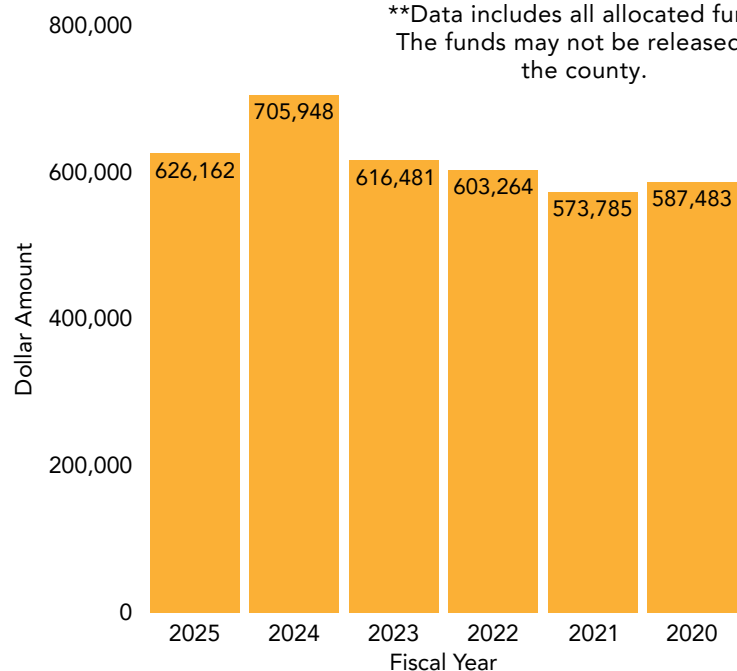
Boone County is served by the Community Development Planning division through a number of regional plans and strategic initiatives monitored and/or administrated by the NKADD:

- The Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS).
- 2024 Hazard Mitigation Plan Update: FEMA requires each jurisdiction included in the regional hazard mitigation plan to adopt the plan.
- The Energy Resilience Hazard Mitigation Plan: Ensuring a proper response for natural disasters impacting energy.

## CENTERLINES

Community Development Planning coordinated with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet to review survey data of the roads in the region to determine ownership of roadways. Between 2023 to 2025, approximately 398 road corrections were made impacting approximately 436.71 miles of roadway in Boone County.

Centerline review impacts road maintenance and County Road Aid Funding. This chart demonstrates the amount allocated and released to Boone County in the last six fiscal years, including FY 2025. Boone County is a part of the Transportation Cabinet's CO-OP program and the county's Road Aid funds are released by the Transportation Cabinet.
